Produces fruit - Matthew 7:16-20

\* Attitude fruit Galatians 5:22-23

Fruit is singular so all the characteristics are produced to some degree in all believers lives.

By yielding to the Holy Spirit we can produce "much fruit" John 15:8.

It is possible that *love* is synonymous with *fruit* and that the Holy Spirit produces this fruit (love - *agape*), Romans 5:5, and the rest of the fruit is the practical manifestations of *agape* in our lives.

- *Joy* the feeling of happiness that comes from a deep-down satisfaction based on spiritual realities. It is not dependent on circumstances. 1 Corinthians 13:6
- Peace the tranquility of mind that comes from spiritual realities. It is also not dependent on<br/>circumstances.1 Corinthians 13:7
- Patience a calm of tolerance & longsuffering in the midst of pain and trials. 1 Corinthians 13:4-5
- *Kindness* tender concern for others. 1 Corinthians 13:4
- Goodness moral and spiritual excellence that is active in helping others. 1 Corinthians 13:5
- *Faithfulness* loyalty and trustworthiness. 1 Corinthians 13:7
- *Gentleness* best understood as *meekness*. We accept God's working in our lives as good and don't resist or dispute. This includes the idea of gentleness. 1 Corinthians 13:4-5

Self-control - restraining passions and appetites. 1 Corinthians 13:5

1)	The world does not understand us	-	vs. 1

Christians can commit sin - 1 John 1:8, 10; 2:1

Commit sin is in the *present tense* and speaks of a linear, ongoing, action. A believer can't *practice* or *habitually* sin.

Be careful about *judging* another person's circumstances. The same circumstances in a Believer's life can be present because of "the trial of faith", 1 Peter 1:6-7, which is not discipline because of sin.
