### Anti-Semitism - A Biblical Position and Action Points

The alarming increase in acts of antisemitism is highlighted by the cold-blooded murder of two young Jewish adults in Washington, DC. Yaron Lischinsky and Sarah Lynn Milgrim were staff members serving in the U.S.-Israeli Embassy in DC. They were shot to death on May 22, 2025, as they attended a cultural event. They were murdered by a gunman yelling "Free Palestine." This young man was apparently radicalized by the false narrative that has dominated national news at protests held on college campuses. These protests claim to support the people of Gaza and oppose Israel's efforts to eliminate Hamas, following the brutal killing of over 1,200 Israelis on October 7, 2023, and the taking of more than 250 hostages into Gaza by Hamas terrorists and Gazan civilians. These protesters have harassed and threatened Jewish college students at both Columbia University and Harvard University. College Presidents have been called to hearings before Congressional committees, and several have resigned over their failure to address or even attempt to stop the harassment of their Jewish students. These chants of "Free Palestine" have been proven to be more than a protest for human rights and are, in fact, blatantly calling for the death of all Jews, not just Israelis, as well as the eradication of all Jews from Israel, which they claim is "Palestine." "From the River to the Sea" is chanted ignorantly by thousands who can't identify which river or which sea. The goal is clearly stated on many websites of international student organizations such as Students for the Justice of Palestine (SJP), as being the removal of all Jews from Israel by any means necessary, and making it the new State of Palestine. It has also come to light that this murdered young Israeli/Jewish couple were believers in Jesus and connected to a Messianic Congregation in Israel. This cancerous ideology long incubated in Mosques by Imams has fully metastasized in US academia, which is demonstrably funded through university departments by nations including Qatar. A whole generation has been brainwashed and reinforced by Hollywood and the liberal news media. The cancer has become systemic and flourishes in the halls of Congress. There are nearly a dozen anti-Israel activist congressional members in the Democratic Party who openly oppose Israel and support this Palestinian ideology. We only need to look at the recent declarations of Canada, France, and England condemning Israel for the war in Gaza to see the not-too-distant political future of America! Scripture tells us that all nations will rise against Israel. Americans must wake up and speak up for Israel and the Jewish people all over the world against this satanic propaganda.

Antisemitism in America is not a Jewish problem, it is undeniably now an American problem. Sadly, Christians can no longer say that anti-Semitism is a secular problem. It is becoming more obvious that it is a Christian problem. Jews are the litmus test of freedom – their fate is the fate of society. The tiny Jewish demographic makes up one-quarter of one percent of the global population. They have been compared to society's "canary in the coal mine." Before miners had good ventilation and high-tech air sniffers to alert unsafe air quality, they kept a canary in the mine to warn of toxic air quality. If the canary died, the miners knew the atmosphere would soon be deadly to breathe. Christianity has been so devoid of Jews and Jewishness for almost two millennia that we have become accustomed to operating with no sensitivity to the health of the "canary." We are so insular in our operations that we have lost our Jewish Awareness and appreciation of the Jewishness of Jesus, the Apostles, the Prophets, and of the New Testament Church, which was made up entirely of Jews. They welcomed Gentiles by faith in Jesus without the Mosaic requirements of the Law or the rite of circumcision (Acts 15).

As Gentile Christians, we are like the proverbial "fish that doesn't know it is wet." We do not recognize anti-Semitism in the same way that a Jewish person does. They have been sensitized over the last 2000 years to detect the wind change that always preceded their persecution, expulsion, or annihilation. We don't see it until it is nakedly obvious, but by then, it is too late. We are like Martin Niemöller, a prominent Lutheran pastor in Germany in the 1920s and early 1930s. After Adolf Hitler came to power in 1933, Niemöller became an outspoken critic of Hitler's interference in the Protestant church. He spent eight years under Nazi rule, from 1937 to 1945, in Nazi prisons and concentration camps. Niemöller said, "First they came for the socialists, and I did not speak out—because I was not a socialist. Then they came for the

trade unionists, and I did not speak out—because I was not a trade unionist. Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out—because I was not a Jew. Then they came for me — and there was no one left to speak for me." He is remembered as one of the more prominent Germans to publicly acknowledge the moral failures of the Church and Germany during the Nazi era. And he continued to speak publicly about the relationship between German civilians' inaction and their responsibility for the persecution and murder of Jews in the Holocaust.<sup>i</sup> He understood firsthand that silence in the face of evil is complicity and that non-involvement is not a hedge of protection but rather delay by appeasement.

American Christians are aware that in the Middle East, some people groups have a deep-seated hatred for the Jews. Many Muslim nations have declared their intention to annihilate Israel, notably Iran, with nuclear weapons. But the problem is no longer just "over there." It is here in America, in our churches and on our campuses. There has been a dramatic increase in antisemitism in the U.S. for decades. One notorious example of antisemitism is blatantly displayed in the statements of Kanye West, a popular and extremely wealthy American rapper, songwriter, and producer. A few years ago, he claimed to be a professing Christian and self-appointed evangelist. West told reporters at GQ, "I'm definitely born again." For a brief period, West launched weekly gatherings, dubbed "Sunday Service." His album Jesus Is King marked a hard flip from his original style of rap. "This album has been made to be an expression of the gospel and to share the gospel and the truth of what Jesus has done to me," West said before the album's release. At an appearance in 2019 at Joel Osteen's Houston mega-church, West said that he was "now working for God.<sup>ii</sup> Sounded good, but that's not where it ended. All churches and believers need to take seriously West's recent statements as reported by Newsweek on Oct. 9, "West tweeted that he was going to go 'death con 3' on the Jewish people." That tweet cost him a 1.5 billion dollar deal with Adidas. Speaking with Chris Cuomo on News Nation Kanya argued that he can't be labeled antisemitic because "black people are actually Jew[s] also." It is no coincidence that antisemitic violence in New York City increased 125% in November 2022, since black rapper, comedian Dave Chappelle, and NBA player Kyrie Irving started spouting anti-Semitic verbiage. This was a green light for minorities to take out their frustrations over perceived inequities against the Jewish people. West made it very clear in December that he "likes the Nazis" and can see "good things about Hitler." West shared a bizarre photo showing images combining the Star of David and a swastika, which led Elon Musk to ban him from Twitter. Then came the early Christmas gift that liberals had been dreaming of when former President Donald Trump hosted Kanye West and Nick Fuentes, whose racist, sexist, and anti-Semitic comments have had him banned across all social media platforms. Trump later explained the dinner was supposed to be with him and West, and that he did not know Fuentes or that he would be attending. But the self-inflicted guilt by association had already set a negative political optic for Trump's 2024 Presidential aspirations. How are Christians and churches to respond to the antisemitic comments of a newly self-proclaimed Christian celebrity? Is there a Christian "evangelical" position on antisemitism, to set itself apart from the Western Church's historic antisemitic legacy of Catholicism and Protestantism? What could conservative independent fundamental churches do beyond the minimum pulpit comment often misquoted thusly that "God will curse him that curses them?" They could make known a firm public position against **all** forms of antisemitism, from websites to social media to quotes on their church signs. Meanwhile, our silence is deafening to the Jewish community. The Jewish family guardians of our Savior Jesus had to flee Bethlehem and their nation, Israel, to escape the antisemitism of Herod to avoid the massacre of the innocents. In the Judgment of the Nations at the end of the Tribulation, mortals will be judged on how they treated" the Jewish people. "In as much as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." (Matthew 25:40). This refers not to His spiritual brethren but to His ethnic brethren by blood, whom the Anti-Christ has been systematically eradicating in an apocalyptic genocide. Zechariah prophesied that 2/3rds of the Jews in the Land would be killed for being Jews. That's a double Holocaust in which 1/3 of Jews were murdered in an industrial operation.

Silence at such a blatant pronouncement of antisemitism by a professing Christian, pop-culture icon is inexcusable. We are already broad-brushed by our association with the historic theological anti-Semitism in "Christendom." Churches cannot just hum *Silent Night* when it is such an unholy night for Jews in America. Our congregations and our communities need not wonder where we stand. Jesus was a Jew. Jesus loved the Jews. Paul said even in their unbelief,

"they are beloved for the fathers' sake" – for the sakes of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob. We love Jesus. We love the Jewish people, and we love all people, for He died for the sins of all. But what have we done to ensure that they know that? To our very great shame, little to nothing. Sitting in a pew saying amen when Genesis 12:1-3 is quoted, or often misquoted, may feel good to us, but it must get outside of the walls of our gathering places to the individual Jews we meet.

Jewish Awareness Ministries rebukes the statements of pop artists, sports stars, comedians, especially Kanye West and his anti-Semitism and theological claims that align with "Black Israelism," which holds that Jews are not the real Jews but that they are. It would take pages to expose that fabricated ideology of cultural misappropriation. Since most churches now have an online public presence, it is no longer enough to offer a rebuttal meant for our in-house audience that Kanye is not a genuine believer. We must address that since Kanye has claimed the flag of our faith, he is to be rebuked until there is complete renunciation and repentance. Despite the fact that he earned conservative applause for supporting a popular politician, our lips can't afford to be sealed to his toxic theology for a few more votes. The secular Jewish community is paying attention to our failure to denounce Kanye's antisemitic remarks. Silence confirms that we are all theologically antisemitic beneath our hypocritical vestments of Christianity. Why would they make that assumption? Because Christendom has a 2000-year track record of theological antisemitism that launched the Crusades, the Spanish Inquisition, and more recently, Nazism. This legacy resulted in the assembly line slaughter of six million Jews in Europe, one and a half million of whom were children. Despite the Ecclesiastical Reformation, both Catholicism and Protestantism remain connected by one evil thread, the dogma that the Jews were cursed for killing God's Son. Our indifference towards Jews will align us with that apostasy. Adolf Hitler wrote, "In defending myself against the Jews, I am acting for the Lord. The only difference between the church and me is that I am finishing the job." He was simply carrying out the logical conclusion of the interpretation of German Lutheran reformation preachers that the Jews killed Christ and were cursed by God, and were enemies of the cross. How conveniently they omitted "love thy enemy, pray for and do good" to your enemy. Nowhere did Jesus teach us to become enemies to those who do not believe in Him, even when persecuted.

#### **Our Fathers Which Art in Hatred**

We must grasp the depth of the history of Christian antisemitism. By the fourth century, the Church Fathers appeared to view any expression of Jewish Christianity as heretical. Before 135 C.E., the predominantly Jewish church in Israel and the churches of Asia Minor celebrated Easter on the 14th day of Nisan (because Jesus died on Passover). The Jerusalem church decided to shift the celebration of the Resurrection to the Sunday after the 14th of Nisan. In 325 AD, Church leaders at the council in Nicaea rejected the Jewish custom (calculation of Passover/Easter date): "It is our duty not to have anything in common with the murderers of our Lord." The practice of celebrating the Resurrection on the 14th of Nisan was now banned. The Roman practice of the Sunday celebration of Easter was official. At the Synod of Antioch in 341 C.E., Church Fathers decreed that those who continued to follow the Jewish-Christian practice would face excommunication. "We ought not therefore to have anything in common with the Jews, for the Savior has shown us another way: we desire dearest brethren to separate ourselves from the detestable company of the Jews..." Only the Roman practice of the Sunday celebration of Easter was allowed. The Council of Nicaea had signed the death warrant for Jewish Christianity. With the declaration of heresy by Epiphanius the Nazarenes (ca.376 C.E.), and Augustine's subsequent endorsement (ca. 400 C.E.), the excommunication of Jewish Christianity from the greater Church was complete.iii Theological antisemitism became the official position of a Christianity that would have been unrecognizable by the first Christians at Antioch. When Satan failed to defeat the Church, he joined it and corrupted its truth. Sadly, the roots of theological anti-Semitism were planted by early church fathers, and by their influence, many have been defiled thereby.

Bishop Melito of Sardis, 167 C.E., composed an Easter homily in which he said, "In rejecting Christ, they rejected God, their election as the people of God, and their salvation. In doing so, they earned God's rejection and the punishment of bitterness and death. Affirmation of Christian belief meant the denial of the equivalent Jewish belief."

Ignatius, the 3rd Bishop of Antioch, 50-117 AD "if anyone celebrates the Passover along with the Jews, or receives emblems of their feast, he is a partaker with those that killed the Lord and his apostles."

Origen, a church father, lived from 184 A.D. to 254 A.D. He was responsible for the early growth of antisemitism in the Church. He believed the Church had replaced Israel because of his anti-Semitism.

Irenaeus, Bishop of Lyon after A.D. 177, declared that the Jews were "disinherited from the grace of God."

Hippolytus of Rome, around A.D. 200, wrote, "Many a time does thou boast thyself that thou didst condemn Jesus of Nazareth to death...Of what retribution does Jesus speak? Manifestly of the misery which has now got hold of thee."

Augustine (354-430 A.D.), famous Bishop of Hippo, "the Jews were marked by God when they murdered Christ so that they cannot be destroyed. Yet their dispersion and misery serve as testimony of their evil and Christian truth."

John Chrysostom (344-407 A.D.), patriarch of Constantinople, wrote eight sermons that showed a violent hatred of the Jews based on the Christ-killer accusation. "The Jews are the most worthless of all men. They are perfidious murderers of Christ. They worship the devil, their religion is a sickness." (Sermons delivered in Antioch in 387.)

## Charges of "Deicide" during the Medieval Period

Blood libel - the allegation that Jews murder non-Jews, especially Christians, to obtain blood for the Passover. It led to trials and massacres of Jews in the Middle Ages and early modern times. It was revived by the Nazis. How ridiculous for Jews who were strictly forbidden to eat blood because of Leviticus 17:11.

Host desecration - The charge that the wafer used in the mass, which was pronounced to be the actual body of Jesus by the Fourth Lateran Council of 1215, was often stolen by Jewish people so they could stab, torment, and burn it, thus inflicting additional pain on Jesus. This charge was leveled against Jewish people all over the Roman Catholic world, frequently bringing with it persecution and massacres.

The Crusaders (1096-1099 A.D.) viciously plundered and killed the Jews of Europe to finance their trip. Once in Jerusalem, they burned the Jews alive in the chief synagogue, circling the screaming, flame-tormented humanity singing 'Christ We Adore Thee!' with their Crusader crosses held high. Because of this, among other atrocities, I personally can no longer sing "Onward Christian Soldiers." With no Biblical source, the "Christian flag" smacks of the antisemitic crusader flag to Jews whose ancestors were locked inside their synagogues and set ablaze by "cross flag" wielding Knights and cross wearing priests.

## **The Reformation**

Martin Luther - In 1543 wrote, among other treatises, *On the Jews and their lies*, "What shall we Christians do with this rejected and condemned people, the Jews? I shall give you my sincere advice. First, to set fire to their synagogues or schools and to bury and cover with dirt whatever will not burn, so that no man will ever again see a stone or cinder of them. This is to be done in honor of our Lord and of Christendom...Second, I advise that their houses also be razed... Third, I advise that all their prayer books and Talmudic writings...be taken from them. Fourth, I advise that their Rabbis be forbidden to teach henceforth on pain of loss of life and limb...Fifth, I advise that safe-conduct on the highways be abolished completely for the Jews...Sixth, I advise that usury be prohibited to them, and that all cash and treasure of silver and gold be taken from them..." Where is the condemnation of this hellish hatred coming from the Father of the Reformation? Even the Vatican has offered a statement against its past antisemitism.

## **Protestant Pre-Holocaust Theology**

Raul Hillberg in *The Destruction of the European Jews,* says, "The missionaries of Christianity had said in effect, You have no right to live among us as Jews. The secular rulers who followed had proclaimed, You have no right to live among us. The German Nazis at last declared, You have no right to live."

Ernst Helmreich in 'The German Churches Under Hitler' summarizes the 1920's: "There were few denunciations of antisemitism in German churches in the 1920s, or for that matter in most pulpits of the Christian world.

Michael Kaufman wrote, in the Dec. 5, 1992 Jerusalem Post, *The Role of the Church's Teachings in Anti-Semitism*: "The Holocaust was largely the product of the incessant teachings of hatred by the Church, and the Church's instigation of their legal, economic and physical persecution over the previous 1500 years."

Knox Theological Seminary - An Open Letter to Evangelicals and Other Interested Parties: The People of God, the Land of Israel, and the Impartiality of the Gospel. (signed by over 150 theologians and pastors) "The present secular state of Israel, however, is not an authentic fulfillment of prophetic realization of the Messianic Kingdom of Jesus Christ. Furthermore, a day should not be anticipated in which Christ's kingdom will manifest Jewish distinctives, whether by its location in 'the land,' by its constituency, or by its ceremonial institutions and practices."

Billy Graham - The Richard Nixon tapes revealed a 90-minute discussion after a prayer breakfast in which Billy Graham said "the Jewish stranglehold on the American media has to be broken... or this country is going down the drain." He uses the phrase "Satanic Jews." Many other negative comments were made. He advised Nixon to get rid of the "damn Jews" from his administration. Abe Foxman of the Anti-Defamation League said, "a trusted spiritual leader of America has been playing a charade for all these years." A late, very weak statement from Graham that he never felt that way toward Jews (contradicting his taped conversation with President Nixon) further angered the Jewish community.

### Christian Palestinianism deceptively wears the cloak of anti-Semitism.

A group of Palestinian Christians associated with the Bethlehem Bible College in Bethlehem, Israel, has been hosting high-profile "Christ at the Checkpoint" conferences that bring evangelical leaders from around the world to "reclaim the prophetic role in bringing peace, justice, and reconciliation in Palestine and Israel." What this means in practice is unceasing criticism of perceived Israeli injustice, racism, and occupation, peppered with special disdain for evangelical Zionists whom they allege exacerbate the conflict by cheerleading "Jewish oppression" of Palestinians.

Jim Fletcher, a long-time Christian publisher, in this interview with Israel National News, warns, "If something isn't done soon, in 10 years, pro-Israel support among American Evangelicals will all be over." Christian Evangelicalism Making Dangerous Pro-Palestinian Swing by Joseph Lanza. Other Protestants, evangelicals and Christian leaders that are pro-Palestinian and opposed to Modern Zionism/Israel theologically to name a few are – Reformed/Replacement Theology, Relevant Magazine, Presbyterian Church USA, Dr. Gary Burge -Wheaton College, Oral Roberts University President -William Wilson, Hank Hanegraaff, Tony Campolo, Frank Schaeffer, John Piper, and Pastor Rick Warren of Saddleback Church. New life has been given to this movement by the United Nations vote in December 2022. The U.N. General Assembly recently passed a resolution by a 90-30 vote to commemorate the Palestinian "Nakba" or day of catastrophe, coinciding with the 75th anniversary of the birth of modern Israel in 1948. Israel's UN Ambassador Gilad Erdan called the vote a "disgrace." Erdan asked the assembly, "What would you say if the international community celebrated the establishment of your country as a disaster? The Palestinian-sponsored resolution supports "a commemoration of Nakba (catastrophe), including organizing a high-level event at the (UN) General Assembly Hall," in May 2023, which will also mark the 75th anniversary of Israel's reestablishment as a nation, declaring on Israel's 75th anniversary that Israel is a catastrophe. They also voted calling on Israel to withdraw from the Golan Heights, annexed in 1981. The Bible is clear about the Jewish identity of Israel and Jerusalem: Jerusalem appears in the Jewish Bible 669 times and Zion 154 times, or 823 times in all. The (NT) mentions Jerusalem 154 times and Zion 7 times; for a total of 984 times, yet neither Jerusalem nor Zion appears in the Quran. Palestinian leadership is sworn to the destruction of Israel. Thus, the motto "Palestine shall be free from the river to the sea," i.e., the boundaries will be from the Jordan to the Med.

BDS - Boycott, Divest, Sanction is an international movement that crosses all sectors of business, politics, and religion to delegitimize and harm Israel economically in support of the "Palestinian" peoples. Boycotts of all products and services made in Israel have swept across the corporate world. Since the Palestinian government has rejected Israel's two-state proposals five times over the last four decades, it is obvious that Israel's complete removal is the goal. This intransigent

position of never missing an opportunity to miss an opportunity has created a power vacuum that has been filled by Iranian proxy terror groups as the shepherds of the Palestinian people: Fatah, Hamas, and Hezbollah. Benjamin Netanyahu on election to his fourth term, said, "Palestinians don't want a state beside Israel they want a state *instead* of Israel." BDS is simply a new Western economic antisemitism repackaged as anti-Zionism. The former holds that Jews have no right to live among the nations, the latter says Israel has no right to a land which Jews call home. Twice in the same chapter, God promised that Israel as a nation would never cease to exist. "Thus saith the LORD, which giveth the sun for a light by day, and the ordinances of the moon and of the stars for a light by night, which divideth the sea when the waves thereof roar; The LORD of hosts is his name: If those ordinances depart from before me, saith the LORD, then the seed of Israel also shall cease from being a nation before me forever." (Jer. 31:35,36)

### Summary

Because this poison keeps popping up from within our circle, our response must be no less than outright condemnation of all forms of antisemitism and calling to task all within our circles, as well as those with whom we politically align. In our articles in the Winter issue 2020 of Israel's Messenger on Anti-Semitism, which are now posted as blogs on www.jewishawareness.org, we unveiled antisemitism in politics, in the BDS movement, in BLM, and in evangelicalism.<sup>1</sup> Those interested in the contradictory facts to the liberal media narrative can click on the YouTube link to our teaching, *Understanding the Israeli Palestinian Conflict.*<sup>4</sup> We as Christians now owe a love debt to the Jewish people with the Gospel of Grace, which came to us through them. Teach through JAM's Jesus in the Feast of Israel in the Gospel of John. (also available online)

Schedule JAM for a Jewish Evangelism training message or weekend mini-seminar.

Contact JAM for a supply of tracts written just for Jewish people.

Contact JAM to support missionaries to reach the Jewish people.

Post messages on your signs and FB pages like: "Don't Hate the People God has Chosen" or "We bless God's Chosen People" or "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem" or "We Worship a Jewish Savior"

Put a statement against antisemitism and replacement theology and for the support of Israel and the Jewish people in your Church Constitution. Completely renounce replacement theology, antisemitism, and anti- Zionism.

Conservative independent churches should become actively supportive of the safety and freedom of Jewish people and of Israel's right to exist securely in every part of the land originally deeded to Abraham by God. (Genesis 13:14-17; 15:18; 17:8; Deut. 11:24).

Bible believing churches should reprioritize all evangelism to be in line with the Romans 1:16 mandate of the Apostle Paul's doctrine and practice. Every missionary should be implored to seek the Jew first on every field.

Bible Believing churches need to increase their Jewish Awareness of the Jewish context of the Gospels and the New Testament. Increase Jewish Awareness of the Biblical Jewish holy days as observed by Jesus and by modern Jews today to build bridges to discuss the Jewishness of Jesus and the early church. Encourage Jewish people to read the "Jewish" Gospels to become aware of how Jesus fulfilled the prophecies and types in their Jewish scriptures. The best way to bless Israel is with Jesus. Love and pray for them, allowing time for the Holy Spirit to open their eyes.
