# **Revive Thy Work**

Habakkuk chapter 3

Does prayer really change things? Some speak thus as if God sits around waiting on our last wish to go into action. Others think that whatever will be will be, so why bother praying? Because God commanded us to pray for starters. It is through prayer that we develop a vital relationship with God. Prayer should not be to change God but rather submitting to God who changes things. Prayer changes us by bringing us into conformity to His will, and once yielded to His purpose our prayers become part of the dynamic involving Him to use us to accomplish His will.

#### Chapter 3 Habakkuk's Prayer

- 1. Revive your work (Vs.1,2).
- 2. Review God's Mighty Power in the Past (Vs.3-15).
- 3. Rest by faith in God's power (Vs.16-19).

#### God's Word

- How could God stand by while evil fills the land? (Vs.1:1-4)
- How could a holy God allow evil men to prosper? (Vs. 1:5-6)
- Habakkuk waited patiently God's answer (V.2:1).
- God's answer (Vs.2:5-19)

#### God's Work

- We often hear "revive your work" as a slogan to promote a revival meeting (V. 3:2).
- The "work" was the one God had just described in chapter 2; Judgment on Judah. Habakkuk had asked God in chapter 1 why He was not judging injustice and evil? (Vs.1:2-6)
- God's work is to reveal Himself to sinners and straying children "in the midst," He asked God to "make known."

## **God's Wonders**

- o From Sinai to Solomon's Temple the Shekinah glory of God appeared as light and fire.
- o In Delivering Israel (v v,2,3) Teman In Edom, Paran In Sinai.
- The awesome shekinah glory of God on Sinai "glory covered the heavens", "brightness of light" –
   "horns ...out of his hand" (Ex. 33:18-23)
- Moses hid in the cleft "burning coals" Ex. 24:17
- o Revelation begins with John seeing such glory. (Rev. 1:13-16)
- When Messiah "God's anointed" (Dan. 2:44-45) comes the whole earth will be filled with this glory.
   (V.2:14)
- o God showed His glory in the Red Sea and the Jordan river. (vv,3:8,9)
- He showed His power when the sun stood still for Joshua. (V. 3:11), (Josh. 10:12-14)
- God is predicted here as using the one he later used to deliver them from Babylon Persian King Cyrus.
   (Jer. 51) Babylon's mighty walls were laid in ruins.

- o Likewise Israel's future scourge Russia will be destroyed on the mountains of Israel. (Ezek. 38)
- o God's anointed will deliver Israel at Armageddon. (Rev. 19:11)

#### **Our Response**

- Habakkuk pleaded to God's tender feelings (*rahem* Hebrew for deep inner feeling) "remember mercy" while He was issuing judgment (V.3:2).
- Jeremiah was there to see the full blow of wrath and the aftermath in Jerusalem. "My soul hath *them* still in remembrance, and is humbled in me. This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hope. It is of the LORD'S mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness. The LORD is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him. The LORD is good unto them that wait for him, to the soul that seeketh him. It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the LORD. " (Lamentations 3"20-26).

### Great is Thy Faithfulness by Thomas O. Chisholm is based on these verses.

- Habakkuk found rest in the midst of destruction (V. 3:16)
- Habakkuk found joy in spite of judgment (V. 3:18)
- Habakkuk found strength in times of stress (V. 3:19)
- Habakkuk found that faith gave him patience to wait in rest, joy and strength. (V. 2:3,4)
