The Millennial Kingdom Part 4

- H. Worship in the Kingdom
 - 1) Jesus will be in Jerusalem Zechariah 2:10; Zephaniah 3:14-17
 - 2) All will worship Him Isaiah 11:9; Psalm 22:27
 - 3) Worship centered in Jerusalem Zechariah 8:20-23; Isaiah 2:2-3
 - 4) The Temple will be rebuilt for worship Zechariah 6:12-13; Isaiah 2:2-3; Ezekiel 40-43 (cf. 43:1-7)

HOW LARGE IS THE TEMPLE AREA?

Measuring device (48:8) – cubit or reed?

Ezekiel 42:15-20 the sanctuary is measured with a "reed"

Ezekiel 45:1-8 the sanctuary area is mentioned with the allotment

The measuring "reed" is 6 cubits long – Ezekiel 40:5

Probably used the Babylonian cubit of 21 inches since Ezekiel is in Babylon

The length of the measuring "reed" is 10.5 feet

The Temple area is 25,000 reeds = 262,500 feet = 49.72 miles x 25,000 reeds = 49.72 miles (Ezek. 48:20)

- 5) Nations will celebrate the Feasts in Jerusalem Zechariah 14:16; Ezekiel 44:24; 45:18, 21; 46:15
- 6) Sacrifices offered Ezekiel 43:13-27; Isaiah 66:20-23; Zechariah 14:16-21; Malachi 3:3-4

The purposes of these are most likely two-fold: a memorial of what Jesus has done and a reminder of the penalty (death) of sin. Also, the sacrifices are a ceremonial cleansing (Ezekiel 45:15, 17, 20) to prevent pollution of the Temple where Jesus is residing. Although similar to the Mosaic system it is not the same.

I. People in the kingdom (those in natural bodies) will only be led astray by their sin nature. The world, since it is now a righteous system, and the Devil have no sway in this time period.

5. Punishment

- A. Violations of justice will be quickly punished Zechariah 14:17-19
- B. Death will come upon those that have not given at least lip-service to the Messiah in the Kingdom Isaiah 65:20
- C. At the end of the 1000 years Satan is loosed for a season; many follow him and they are destroyed Revelation 20:7-10

The details of the future map of the Land of Israel are mentioned only cryptically in the Tanach and various Talmudic sources.




Fig. 10.1 Map of Israel in the Kingdom
